
Behind the Holiday Table


What's keeping costs at a rolling boil?

INGREDIENTS

The producer price index, which tracks more than 1,500 ingredients and inputs, has hit record highs throughout 2021.




PACKAGING

Packaging materials are now costing as much as 22% more than last year. Prices have remained elevated throughout the pandemic.



LABOR

Even with wages increasing, there is a labor shortage:
Nearly 140,000
CPG manufacturing jobs are waiting to be filled.



SHIPPING

With stalled cargo ships, 80,000 more truck drivers needed and skyrocketing diesel costs in the last year, getting goods delivered to consumers costs 71% more than last year.
